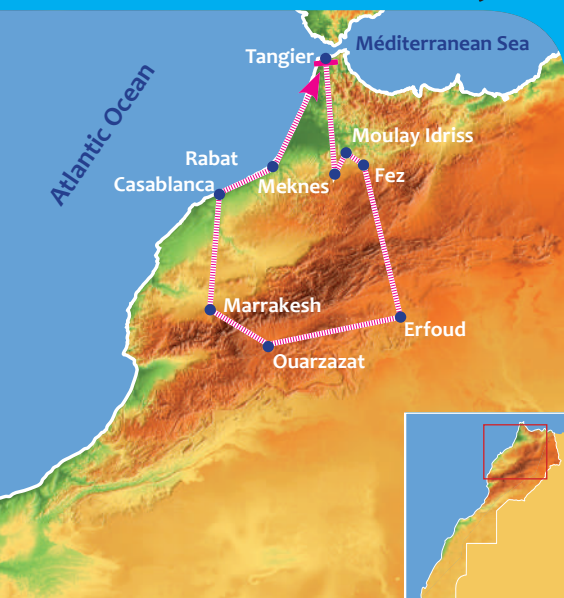

Imperial cities of Morocco and the great south – the route of the 1000 Kasbahs. Space where one could discover authentic Morocco: Desert, Oasis, Palm trees, Rose-raies, Kasbahs of 1001 nights.

Day 1 | Tangier

Arrival at the quay of Tangier.

Tangier was once an international city, offering an attractive blend of Africa, Europe and the East.

At the beginning, you can visit the new city, a quarter of its inhabitants are of international origin (French, English, Dutch, German, Spanish, American and Italian). Then we take you to the Diplomatic Forest, through Cape Spartel, where the Mediterranean Sea meets the Atlantic Ocean.

You will visit the Hercule Caves and then return to the old town for a visit.

Continuation on foot towards the Kasbah and the souks of the Grand and the Small Socco.

Dinner and overnight at the selected hotel in Tangier.

Day 2 | Tangier - Meknes - Volubilis - Moulay Idriss - Fez

Departure for Meknes, the second imperial city.

Enormous walls surround the famous city of the powerful Sultan Moulay Ismail.

You will visit the most monumental gates of Morocco, Bab El Mansour, the tomb of Moulay Ismail, the stables and the flour mills, as well as the Souks.

Then you can visit the beautiful and stable garden “Haras Meknes”, the largest and most important of the country.

Continue to Volubilis, the most important Roman ruins in Morocco.

After visiting the site, we will continue to the small village of Moulay Idriss who was the founder of the first Moroccan dynasty.

Continue to Fez for dinner and accommodation in a selected hotel.

Day 3 | Fez

The city of Fez is the religious and cultural center of Andalusian art with more than 400 mosques, medersas and wells.

The city is a labyrinth of narrow streets.

There are countless small artisan workshops where everything is done by hand.

You return to the Middle Ages. During the visit, we see the Zaouia (mausoleum) of Moulay Idriss I, the mosque of Karaouine, one of the oldest mosques and schools in the Arab world, Medersa Attarine, the Koranic school with its large blue door.



This city is classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
Dinner and accommodation at a selected hotel in Fez.

Day 4 | Fez - Erfoud

Departure for the Middle Atlas towards Erfoud.

You will leave the city of Fez to cross the Middle Atlas above the Zad Pass, through the mountains without vegetation, then arrive at the town of Midelt.

This city was founded at the beginning of this century, as a military base. It is best known for its mining industry.

Then you continue south, arriving at the pass of Tizi N'Talrhemt, the vegetation begins to change, before reaching the city of Errachidia. You will travel along a large plateau cut by the valley of Ziz which offers its new visitor a splendid view over the valley with red-brown Ksour, the special construction of the houses and green gardens of the oasis, which surround The walls of the valley.

Late afternoon, you will reach the town of Erfoud for dinner and accommodation at a selected hotel.

Day 5 | Erfoud - Ouarzazate

After breakfast, you leave Erfoud and head westwards across a desert plain, varied and undulating with small oases and sand dunes to Tinghir. About 1 km behind the town of Tinghir, the road leads to impressive Todra Gorges, which are formed by the erosion of the Todra River, from the High Atlas.

Their nearly vertical rock walls are 300m high and 10m wide.

Then back to Tinghir, continue to El Kelaa de Mgouna and departure for the route of the 1001 Kasbahs in the direction of Ouarzazate. Dinner and accommodation at a selected hotel in Ouarzazate.

Day 6 | Ouarzazate - Marrakech

You will leave the city of Ouarzazate towards the north to Ksar Ait Benhaddou, famous for its Kasbah. You will pass through a fantastic landscape at Tizi-n-Tichka (2,260 m), a spectacular example of the High Atlas Mountains.

This road is one of the most picturesque, beautiful and impressive mountains of Morocco.

Later, you will pass by the massive plateau of Haouz, before reaching the city of Marrakech for dinner and accommodation in a selected hotel.

Day 7 | Marrakech

Visit the city of Marrakech, the Palmeraie located in the mountains of the High Atlas, an oasis on the edge of the desert.

In this city you will have a feeling of Africa and the Orient at the same time.

At the entrance of the city, more than 100,000 palm trees rise and offer a



splendid view.

The lively souks, the Palmeraie and the red buildings give a desert stamp to Marrakech.

You will visit the Koutoubia mosque, a “work of art” of Hispano-Moorish architecture, the gardens of the Menara, the Saadian tombs, the Bahia Palace, Bab Agnaou, the oldest gate of the Medina, the souks, That the famous place Djemaa-el-Fna, where all day long, you can find traders, storytellers, jugglers, musicians, card players always with very long queues!

Dinner and accommodation at a selected hotel in Marrakech.

Day 8 | Marrakech - Casablanca - Rabat

Departure to Casablanca, the second largest city in Africa, located on the Atlantic coast and the largest industrial and commercial center of the continent.

You then reach Rabat, the administrative capital and the residence of the king.

You will visit the outer part of the Royal Palace, the Hassan Tower and the Mausoleum Mohamed V.

Dinner and accommodation in Rabat.

Day 9 | Rabat - Tangier

After breakfast departure to the port of Tangier.

Advice :

- Continue with Land Rover on the slopes of the small oases of Merzouga.
- In Merzouga, around impressive sand dunes, which can sometimes reach up to 100 m high, you can contemplate the sunset.
